Dear parents,

Up until now, it has been customary in February to give an interim report to parents and children that describes the child's school performance. Now there is the opportunity for the class teacher and your child to have a joint dialogue about what skills your child has already mastered and what skills it might have to practice a bit more. At the end of this conversation, goals for the next few months will be written down together. You as a parent will initially participate in this conversation as a listener, possibly towards the end of the conversation also as a dialogue partner.

Past experience shows that the children are really looking forward to this dialogue – a one-toone conversation with their teacher! Talking about skills and knowledge together is very motivating for the children. They take responsibility for their own learning.
